**NO PURCHASE OR PAYMENT NECESSARY TO ENTER OR WIN.
VOID WHERE PROHIBITED. SOME RESTRICTIONS MAY APPLY.**

1. ELIGIBILITY: The Discovery Education and Arconic Foundation “Manufacture Your Future” Challenge (“Contest”) is a trade promotion offered only within the 50 United States and the District of Columbia (the “Eligibility Area”) and open only to eligible teachers employed by eligible schools. An eligible teacher (“Teacher”) must be: [a] 21 years of age or older; [b] a legal resident of the Eligibility Area, and [c] a full-time or part-time employee of an eligible school who provides direct instruction to students in any grade from Kindergarten through Grade 12. An eligible school is defined as a public, private or parochial school located within the Eligibility Area that: [a] is organized and primarily operated for educational purposes; [b] contains any class with students in Kindergarten through Grade 12; [c] is considered tax-exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Tax Code (or has an equivalent tax-exempt designation as determined by Sponsor, or is registered as a public school with the National Center for Educational Statistics); and [d] **is NOT involved (at the time of the judging, winner verification, and/or prize award) in formal negotiations with Sponsor for new/additional Discovery Education services.** Employees, officers and directors of Discovery Communications, LLC (“Sponsor”), its promotional partner Arconic Foundation, Promotion Mechanics, Inc. (“Administrator”), and all of their respective parents, subsidiaries, affiliates, advertising and promotion agencies, promotional suppliers, and the immediate family members (spouse, and parents, siblings, and children and their respective spouses, regardless of where they live) or members of the same households (whether related or not) of such employees, officers and directors (collectively, “Contest Entities”) are not eligible to enter the contest. Sponsor’s determinations of eligibility are final and may be made at any time. Void outside the Eligibility Area and where prohibited.

2. BRIEF CONTEST DESCRIPTION: The objective of the Contest is for Teachers (working alone, or in “Teams” of two to four Teachers who work at the same school) to create a Contest entry in accordance with the Challenge outlined in Section 5 below. Complete entry requirements and instructions are available at www.manufactureyourfuture.com/challenge (the “Website”). Entries will be judged according to the process and criteria set forth in Section 8. There is a limit of one (1) entry per eligible Teacher, regardless of whether that Teacher participates as an individual or as part of a Team. A Teacher may not participate as a member of more than one Team. If the Sponsor learns that one Teacher is on two separate participating Teams, it may disqualify one or both Teams in its sole discretion. The Releasees (as defined in Section 13 below) hereby disclaim any and all liability or responsibility for disputes arising between Team members related to this Contest.

3. CONTEST TIMING:

- Entry “Submission Period”: The entry Submission Period begins at 5:00 PM Eastern Daylight Time (“EDT”) on June 18, 2018 and ends at 5:00 PM EDT on October 22, 2018.
- Judging: All eligible entries will be judged by the Sponsor’s designated judges in accordance with the Judging Criteria set forth in Section 8 below, to determine the potential winners. Judging will be completed (and potential winners notified) during November 2018.
- Winner Announcement: The winners will be announced at the Website on or by December 31, 2018.

4. AGREEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULES: Participation in the Contest constitutes full and unconditional agreement to and acceptance of these Official Rules and the decisions of the Sponsor and Judges (which are final and binding) by each Teacher and each associated school. Winning a prize is contingent upon fulfilling all requirements set forth herein. The Sponsor reserves the right in its sole discretion to disqualify any entry at any time in the event it is determined that any Teacher or school associated with the entry has not agreed to or complied with these Official Rules. By entering the Contest, each Teacher represents and warrants that the associated school: (a) has full knowledge of his/her actions in conjunction with the Contest; (b) has consented to participation in the Contest by the Teacher and any applicable students; and (c) has

consented to the potential receipt of the applicable prize(s) described below. The Releasees (as defined in Section 13 below) hereby disclaim any and all liability or responsibility for disputes arising between an employee and their employer related to this Contest.

5. THE CHALLENGE: Teachers (working alone, or in Teams of two to four Teachers who work at the same school) will create (i) a video pitch, and (ii) a written proposal for an in-school experience that will bring manufacturing careers to life for their students, and help them explore different career pathways in advanced manufacturing.

Video pitch length must be at least 60 seconds and no more than 120 seconds in length.

Written proposals must be submitted in .pdf format and must include the following:

- A description of the proposed in-school experience,
- A description of how a \$5,000 grant would be used to implement the experience
- Information about the individuals who will plan and host the event
- A description of the intended student audience for the event
- A list of critical resources, including at least one Manufacture Your Future resource (see <http://www.manufactureyourfuture.com> for available resources)
- An explanation of how the students will benefit from the experience and how it will inspire them to explore different career pathways in advanced manufacturing

See Section 6 below for additional entry requirements and restrictions, Section 7 below for how to submit an entry, and Section 8 below for judging criteria.

6. ADDITIONAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: The entry must be the original work of the applicable Teacher/Team. Do not include any branded products, trademarks or logos in the entry, other than trademarks or logos owned by Discovery or Arconic Foundation (the "Provided Elements"). Entries which contain a trademark or logo or promote any brand or product other than those belonging to Discovery or Arconic Foundation may be disqualified at the Sponsor's sole discretion; however, the Sponsor may choose not to disqualify an entry which includes a trademark or logo if the Sponsor determines in its sole discretion that the inclusion of such trademark or logo is incidental. Entrants may be asked to sign an affidavit stating that entrant was not paid a fee, either monetary or in-kind, to promote an included trademark, logo or branded product. Entries may not defame or invade the privacy or publicity rights of any person, living or deceased, or otherwise infringe upon a person's personal or proprietary rights. The concept, ideas, and language used in the Entry Video must be wholly original to the applicable Teacher/Team.

By participating, each Teacher represents and warrants that: (a) the Teacher/Team is the creator of the entry; (b) the entry is original; (c) the entry conforms to all requirements stated in these Official Rules and at the Website; (d) the entry does not contain confidential material nor infringe the intellectual property, privacy or publicity rights or any other legal or moral rights of any third party; and (e) the entry has not been previously published in any medium (apart from posting the video portion as an unlisted video on YouTube in accordance with these Official Rules), nor has it won any previous awards or recognitions.

Entry videos may not contain any music or sound effect unless either: [a] the music/sound effect was created by the Teacher/Team or by someone who has given the Teacher/Team written permission to use his/her music/sound effect; [b] the music composition is in the public domain and was performed by the Teacher/Team or by someone who has given the Teacher/Team written permission to use his/her performance; or [c] the music/sound effect was acquired/licensed by the Teacher from a royalty-free source **which does not require credits or other attribution to appear in connection with the entry video.** Teachers must be certain that any music or sound effect conforms to all applicable requirements. Sponsor's determination as to whether any entry potentially violates the rights of any third party is final. It is further recommended that the statement "This is my/our Manufacture Your Future contest entry video" be made at the beginning of each Entry Video.

Further, by participating, each Teacher/Team: (a) agrees to waive any claim for reimbursement for any equipment or materials necessary to submit an entry regardless of whether or not any particular entry is selected for any prize; (b) acknowledges that the material that will be submitted as part of the Contest may embody materials, suggestions, or ideas similar to those which have been developed by others or by the Contest Entities and hereby acknowledges that any similarity is purely coincidental and unavoidable in light of the volume of ideas that the Contest Entities routinely use and consider in the course of each of their

business activities, and understands that he/she will not be entitled to any compensation because of use by the Contest Entities of any materials similar to those in a Teacher/Team's Entry; (c) hereby waives any right to any claim or liability with respect to the Contest Entities' use of similar materials; and (d) understands that submitting any element that is copyrighted by another individual will result in the applicable Teacher(s) being responsible for any legal action the legal copyright holder might take against the Releasees (as defined below in Section 13).

If an entry does include the likeness of any people, the Teacher/Team must obtain written permission from each person (and if such person has not reached the age of majority in his/her jurisdiction of residence (a "Minor"), his/her parent/legal guardian ("Parent")) whose name, image, likeness and/or voice ("Likeness") is included in the entry. Each Teacher/Team further represents and warrants that such person(s) have granted the Teacher/Team all necessary rights to use their likeness, and that the Teacher/Team will make written copies of such permissions available to the Sponsor upon request.

The entry must be submitted in English.

Participants must not engage in any violent, dangerous, or illegal behavior in creating an entry. The Sponsor and Arconic Foundation, as applicable reserve the right in their sole discretion to disqualify any entry at any time which, in the Sponsor's/Arconic Foundation's reasonable opinion: [a] is deemed to be immoral, obscene, profane, defamatory or not in keeping with the Sponsor's or Arconic Foundation's image (as applicable); [b] contains dangerous conduct, stunts or tricks that could lead to physical injury or property damage; [c] endangers the safety or well-being of any person; [d] violates any law or regulation; [e] violates or infringes (or may infringe) on any copyright, trademark, logo or other proprietary right of any person living or deceased; [f] invades the privacy or publicity rights of any person, living or deceased; [g] defames, misrepresents or contains disparaging remarks about Sponsor or its products, or other people, products or companies; or [h] is in violation of these Official Rules.

By participating, each Teacher agrees not to instigate, support, maintain, or authorize any action, claim, or lawsuit against the Releasees (as defined in Section 13 below) or any other person or entity, on the grounds that any use of the entry or any derivative works, infringes any of their rights, including, without limitation, copyrights and moral rights. Releasees are not responsible for unauthorized third-party use of any entry.

Teachers may be required to obtain written permission and/or provide releases, as solely determined by the Sponsor, to allow Sponsor to post the entry and/or to otherwise use the entry in accordance with the requirements of this Contest, and the advertising, promotion, and publicity of this Contest, and Official Rules. The form of any such permission or release will be as solely determined by, or acceptable to the Sponsor. Failure by the Sponsor to request such permission(s) and/or release(s) is not a waiver of the Sponsor's right to require the same, and the applicable Teachers acknowledge that failure to comply with any such request may cause disqualification. Other than for winner notification and verification, neither the Sponsor, nor anyone acting on its behalf, will enter into any unsolicited communication with any entrant regarding this Contest, nor will entries be acknowledged or returned.

By participating, each Teacher further acknowledges that the Sponsor is in no way obligated to broadcast, publish or use any entry in any way. Nothing herein shall constitute an employment, joint venture, or partnership relationship between any Teacher and the Sponsor or Promotional Partner. In no way is any Teacher to be construed as the agent or to be acting as the agent of the Sponsor or Promotional Partner.

Teachers agree that, upon request by the Sponsor, Teachers will provide a digital copy of the entry video in native format, and remove the entry video from YouTube if/as directed by the Sponsor.

The Sponsor reserves the right in its sole discretion to disqualify any entry at any time which, in the Sponsor's reasonable opinion, does not conform to the requirements stated in these Official Rules or at the Website.

7. TO REGISTER AND ENTER: Note that Teachers participating as a Team will be responsible for first naming one (1) Teacher as the "Teacher Team Leader" for the Team, who will submit the Team's entry on behalf of the Team. The Contest Entities hereby disclaim any liability for any disputes between Team members arising under or related to the Contest.

To prepare for entry, the applicable Teacher must first visit the Website to create a username and password, register themselves (or their Team) for entry into the Contest, then review the entry form and instructions detailed at the Website, which are incorporated herein by reference.

To prepare to submit the video portion of the entry, the applicable Teacher (or Teacher Team Leader, as applicable) must first create a registered user account at www.youtube.com and agree to all applicable terms at that site. There is no fee or charge to become a registered user of YouTube. YouTube is not a sponsor of this Contest, nor does it endorse or administer the Contest. Further, entries which do not comply with the YouTube [Community Guidelines](#) will be disqualified.

Next, the applicable Teacher must access their YouTube account, upload the video, title the video "Manufacture Your Future Submission – [Your title]", **set the video's privacy settings to "Unlisted"**, note the unique URL that YouTube has given the video. Entry video file size limitation and file format must adhere to YouTube specifications. In order for an entry video to be considered for judging, the Teacher must maintain their YouTube account in good standing and must continue to host the video through February 28, 2019 at the same URL disclosed in the Contest entry, with the video's privacy settings set to "Unlisted" (unless asked by Sponsor to remove the video from YouTube prior to this date).

Then, during the Submission Period, the Teacher must visit the Website, login by using his/her username and password to access the entry page, and provide the Teacher/Team's response to the prompts and questions on the entry form, along with the written proposal portion of the entry in .PDF format, and the unique YouTube URL for the video portion of their entry.

Once the entry form is completed, the applicable Teacher must click the "Submit" button at the bottom of the form so that the entry is received by Sponsor's server no later than 5:00 PM ET on October 22, 2018. If a Teacher wishes to save their (or their Team's) work prior to submitting the entry, he/she may click the "Save" button at the bottom of the entry form, then return prior to 5:00 PM ET on October 22, 2018 to update the entry information and click the "Submit" at the bottom of the entry form. Once an entry form has been submitted, no further edits are permitted (unless a specific edit to entry materials is requested by Sponsor, as described in Section 12 below). If an entry form has not been submitted by 5:00 PM ET on October 22, 2018, the entry will not be included in the Contest judging.

There is a limit of one (1) entry per eligible Teacher, regardless of whether that Teacher participates as an individual or as part of a Team. A Teacher may not participate as a member of more than one Team. Entries received in excess of stated limits will be void.

8. DETERMINATION OF WINNERS: All entries will first be screened to ensure they meet the entry criteria. A panel of judges from Discovery Education and Arconic Foundation will then score all qualifying entries using the following Judging Criteria:

- Quality of Entry Video (25%) – (i.e. is the video easy to understand and follow? Does it connect to the written component of the entry?)
- Quality of Written Component (25%) – (i.e. is the written component of the entry clear, concise, and thoroughly developed? Does it include the required components described in Section 5 above?)
- Addresses Needs of Students (25%) – (i.e. how well is the proposed event tailored to engage the intended student audience?)
- Creativity (25%)

The highest scoring entry will be deemed the potential First Place winning entry. The second highest scoring entry will be deemed the potential Second Place winning entry. The third highest scoring entry will be deemed the potential Third Place winning entry. Following that, the next ten highest scoring entries will each be deemed a potential Fourth Place winning entry.

Winning a prize is contingent upon verification of eligibility and continued compliance with these Official Rules and the Sponsor's instructions. In the event of any ties, the "Quality of Written Component" score will be used as a tiebreaker. In the event a tie remains after applying this tiebreaker, an additional tie-breaking judge selected by Sponsor will determine the winner between the tied entries based on the Judging Criteria. The decisions of the Sponsor and Judges are final and binding in all matters.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Rules, if at any time the Sponsor determines that not enough or no eligible entrants exist from which to determine any one or more of the prize winners, then the Sponsor may in its sole and exclusive discretion determine that not enough or no eligible entries exist, and then may either suspend or terminate the Contest or modify it (or any parts thereof) in any equitable manner that the Sponsor deems appropriate in its sole and exclusive discretion, including, without limitation, by not awarding any one or more of the prizes set forth in these rules.

9. PRIZES: The following prizes will be made available:

One (1) First Prize: a \$5,000 grant awarded as a check made payable to the school associated with the First Place entry (to be used to implement the student experience described in the First Place entry), an In-School Winner Announcement Event to be held at the school associated with the winning entry, and a trip to the Discovery Educator Network Summer Institute for the First Place Teacher(s), all as subject to the additional applicable terms in these Official Rules.

One (1) Second Prize: a \$3,500 grant awarded as a check made payable to the school associated with the Second Place entry, to be used to implement portions of the student experience described in the Second Place entry. Prior to issuance of grant check, Second Place winner will be required to submit a modified proposal and budget for their project, showing how they intend to implement portions of their original proposal with the \$3,500 grant.

One (1) Third Prize: a \$1,500 grant awarded as a check made payable to the school associated with the Third Place entry, to be used to implement a portion of the student experience described in the Third Place entry. Prior to issuance of grant check, Third Place winner will be required to submit a modified proposal and budget for their project, showing how they intend to implement portions of their original proposal with the \$1,500 grant.

Ten (10) Fourth Prizes: The opportunity for the Teacher(s) associated with each Fourth Place entry to create a project request on www.DonorsChoose.org and direct a \$1,000 donation from Arconic Foundation toward the project. Limit one such donation per Fourth Prize.

Limit one (1) prize per school. See additional prize restrictions in Sections 10, 11 and 12 below.

First Place through Third Place entrants will be required to provide periodic (at least monthly) status updates to Sponsor on the progress of their student experience planning, as well as a recap statement about the student experience, which must occur no later than April 30, 2019. Any prize details not specified herein will be determined by the Sponsor in its sole discretion. Prizes are not transferable or refundable and must be accepted as awarded. No other substitutions may be made, except by the Sponsor, who reserves the right to substitute a prize (or component thereof) with another prize (or component thereof) of comparable or greater value. Sponsor will not be liable for any delay, curtailment or non-occurrence of any part of the Contest or prize, which in each case arises from any cause or causes beyond Sponsor's reasonable control including without limitation any of the following: act of God, governmental act, war, terrorism, adverse weather conditions, fire, flood, explosion or civil commotion. Prize recipients are solely responsible for all applicable federal, state, and local taxes and for any expenses, costs or fees associated with acceptance and/or use of prizes not specified herein as being included. Prizes are awarded "as is" with no warranty or guarantee, either express or implied.

10. FIRST PLACE IN-SCHOOL EVENT TERMS AND RESTRICTIONS: All details regarding the In-School Winner Announcement Event ("Event") will be determined by Sponsor, in Sponsor's sole discretion. The Event is an educational opportunity to which no retail value is ascribed. The Event is anticipated to take place during November or December 2018, however note that Sponsor will determine the actual date, location, time, length of the assembly. The grade level and number of students invited to attend the Event will be determined by Sponsor, in Sponsor's sole discretion, based on the population of the School and the School's ability to accommodate the Event. Further, the school associated with the First Place entry must allow representatives from Sponsor and Arconic Foundation to attend the student experience (i.e. the culminating event of the grant project, the "Student Experience") at the school, to film the Event and Student Experience, and to use the resulting footage for purpose of publicizing this and future Sponsor and Arconic Foundation promotions. As a condition of attendance at the Event or Student Experience, Sponsor reserves the right to require each attendee (and if a Minor, such attendee's Parent[s]) to complete a permission form (including a liability release and [where legal] publicity release), in accordance with Sponsor's instructions. If

a school is not willing or able to accommodate the Event and Student Experience as described herein, Sponsor reserves the right to disqualify the associated First Place entry and entrants, and to award the First Place Prize to the next highest scoring entry, pending verification of eligibility and continued compliance with these Official Rules.

11. FIRST PLACE TEACHER TRIP TERMS AND RESTRICTIONS: Each Teacher entrant associated with the verified First Place winning entry will receive a six-day, five-night, all-expense paid trip to the Discovery Educator Network Summer Institute (“DENSI”), anticipated to take place at a location to be determined by Sponsor within the 48 contiguous United States during the summer of 2019 (the “Trip”). Trip includes: round trip coach air travel for winner (traveling alone, without a guest) to the Chicago, Illinois area from the major gateway airport closest to winner’s residence; double occupancy accommodations on a college campus selected by Sponsor for five (5) nights; attendance at certain portions of the DENSI; ground transportation between destination airport, accommodations, and DENSI; and all meals. Any Trip details not specified herein shall be determined by Sponsor in its sole discretion. Airports, airlines, hotel, and any other elements of the Trip will be selected by Sponsor in its sole discretion. The total approximate retail value (“ARV”) of the Trip is \$1,000. Actual value may vary based on fare fluctuations and point of departure. The winner will not receive cash or any other form of compensation if actual travel costs are less than the estimate made in these Official Rules. Trip must be taken on dates specified by Sponsor (anticipated to be known and disclosed in early 2019) or prize will be forfeited in its entirety. All travel is subject to approval of Sponsor. Winner is responsible for all necessary travel authorizations and documents (including government issued picture identification and/or passport with necessary validity, as required). For the avoidance of doubt, round trip coach air travel is limited to one plane seat per traveler. Airline tickets are non-refundable/non-transferable and are not valid for upgrades and/or frequent flyer miles. All airline tickets are subject to flight variation, work stoppages, and schedule or route changes. Sponsor reserves the right to structure travel route and select accommodations in its sole and absolute discretion. Sponsor shall not be responsible for any cancellations, delays, diversions or substitution or any act or omissions whatsoever by the air carriers, hotels, venue operators, transportation companies, prize providers or any other persons providing any prize-related services or accommodations. No refund or compensation will be made in the event of the cancellation or delay of any transportation or other prize element except at the sole and absolute discretion of Sponsor. Trip winner is also responsible for obtaining travel insurance (and all other forms of insurance) at his/her own option and expense, and hereby acknowledges that Sponsor has not and will not obtain or provide travel insurance or any other form of insurance. Lost, stolen or damaged airline tickets, travel vouchers or certificates will not be replaced or exchanged. All expenses not specifically included as part of the prize, are not included as part of any prize package, and are solely the winner’s responsibility, including, but not limited to: additional ground transportation, travel insurance, room service, bag check fees, parking fees, laundry service, merchandise, souvenirs, telephone calls, tips, gratuities and service charges. Transportation carrier and hotel regulations and conditions apply. In the event a prize winner engages in behavior that (as determined by Sponsor or any prize provider in its or their sole and absolute discretion) is obnoxious, inappropriate, threatening, illegal or that is intended to annoy, abuse, threaten or harass any other person, Sponsor reserves the right to terminate the Trip or other applicable experience early. By accepting a travel prize, the winner represents that he/she understands that travel, whether by plane, automobile, or other conveyance, or by foot, and in the air, contains some inherent element of risk of accident, illness, injury, loss or death, which may be caused by negligence, forces of nature, or other agencies, known or unknown. Winner furthers represents that he/she recognizes that such risks may be present at any time before, during and after the trip. In order to be considered a travel prize winner and partake of the enjoyment of this trip, the winner must be willing to accept the risk, and to confirm their acceptance to such risk in writing at Sponsor’s request. If a winner lives within 200 miles of the selected destination (as determined by Sponsor), Sponsor reserves the right in its sole discretion to substitute ground transportation in lieu of airfare for that winner, and any difference in value will not be awarded.

12. WINNER NOTIFICATION AND ADDITIONAL PRIZE DETAILS: The Teacher (or for Teams, the Teacher Team Leader) associated with a potential winning entry will be notified during November 2018 by phone and/or e-mail, to verify his/her eligibility and obtain any additional requested contact information. If such a Teacher is not available or if there is no answer at the time any notification telephone call is made, a phone message will be left (if possible). Any such phone message or e-mail will instruct the Teacher to call a specified telephone number or reply by e-mail within two (2) full business days after the time that the notification message was left. The Teacher must reply as instructed to identify him/herself, confirm his/her eligibility, and provide any additional requested contact information within such two (2) full business day period, or the applicable entry will be disqualified. Teachers may only be notified one time as set forth above for attempted prize notification. Potential prize recipients and any participants associated with a potential

winning entry may subsequently be required to complete an affidavit of eligibility, liability, intellectual property and (where legal) publicity release, and provide any additional information that may be required by Sponsor, within the time period specified in the notification document. All such documents will be sent to the applicable Teacher (or for Teams, the Teacher Team Leader), who will be responsible for collecting completed documents and forwarding to the Sponsor or its designee. Further, each Teacher/Team may also be required to complete and submit a revised version of their entry materials which address all of the Sponsor's concerns (including, but not limited to, intellectual property rights concerns) as presented at the time of notification as a potential winner. Prize recipients who will receive prizes valued at \$600 or more will also be required to return a properly completed IRS W-9 form within the time period specified by Sponsor, and such prize recipient will receive an IRS Form 1099 issued in their name for the actual value of prizes received. Proof of identity, age, and legal residence may be required to claim a prize. Any potential winner or prize recipient may be disqualified in Sponsor's sole discretion if: (a) the participant or prize recipient associated with a potential winning entry fails to provide any required information or properly completed documents within the required time period; (b) the participant or prize recipient associated with a potential winning entry fails to comply with any of the terms of these Official Rules; or (c) if any prize or prize notification is returned as undeliverable, or any voice-mail or message left is not timely returned.
